

# Sexual Violence Education at Institutions for Higher Education



The College is committed to providing awareness to its community regarding Sexual Violence Education and Awareness. The program was developed to provide the following:

- A discussion of sexual violence.
- A discussion of consent, including an explanation that the victim is not at fault.
- A discussion of drug and alcohol-facilitated sexual violence.
- Information relating to risk education and personal protection.
- Information on where and how to get assistance, including the importance of medical treatment and evidence collection, and how to report sexual violence to campus authorities and local law enforcement.
- The possibility of pregnancy and transmission of sexual diseases.
- Introduction of members of the educational community.
- A promise of discretion and dignity.
- A promise of confidentiality for victims of sexual assault.

## The Program

All students will view in class the 25 minute video prepared by Security on Campus, Inc. “Speak Out and Stand Up: Raising Awareness About Sexual Assault” with Kristen Stewart during First Class (new student orientation) or first week of classes.

The Vice President of Administrative Services is the compliance officer regarding Act 104 and Title IX. Selected staff will present to the students the importance of contacting local authorities first and the campus authorities should they need to report an incidence of sexual violence with the 24/7 Hotline information from RAINN and WOAR.

Links to both RAINN and WOAR will be forwarded to the student iPads as well as supporting handouts.

Students will receive helpful information to better protect themselves from sexual violence.

All students will be required to sign the One Student Pledge which will be placed in the students file.
