

Min-Refrigerators



Some students moving into our *Residential Learning* buildings like the idea of having a mini-refrigerator in their room. But; review this info and then decide.

Here are some very important considerations:

- You do NOT necessarily need your own mini-refrigerator in your room.
- Every *Residential Learning* building has a snack-center with two FULL-SIZED refrigerators with freezers.
- We will only permit mini-refrigerators that are 2-cubic feet or less; and no larger than 20 inches high, and 19 inches wide.
- Why the size limits? Space limitations, being fair to your roommate, and electricity demand (110-volt maximum).
- *Are you hungry?* Consider these facts...
- Of course, *Walnut Hill College* offers breakfast, brunch, lunch, dinner, and snacks six-days per week.
- There are over 300 restaurants in University City.
- There are two full-service supermarkets within two blocks of the college. They are both on *Walnut Street*; the same street as the college. They are both open from 7:00 AM to 11:00 PM; 7 days per week. They also sell prepared foods.
- There is a 7-11 next to the college that is open 24/7 and three *Wawa* in *University City*.
- There are three full-service pharmacies in *University City* that also sell prepared-foods, snacks and groceries.
- There are over 100 pizzerias, cafes and fast-food restaurants in *University City*.



FAQs

Q. What do you recommend? Do I really need a mini-refrigerator in my room?

A No; given that there are two full-size refrigerators in each dorm building, the college offering breakfast, brunch, lunch, dinner and snacks six-day per week, and that they are hundreds of choices of restaurants and stores within a few blocks, you do NOT need a mini-refrigerator.

Q. Should I consider speaking with my roommate so that only one of us brings a mini-refrigerator? That will save space and money.

A. YES! That is a very practical idea.

Q. What are the size limitations?

A. No more than 2-cubic feet, 20 inches high, 19 inches wide.

Q. When we arrive on Welcome Home Day; and begin the process of moving in, what will happen with my belongings? If I do decide that I really need a minirefrigerator in my room, how will I bring it in?

A. On *Welcome Home Day* you will notice almost 100 college team members and upperclassmen volunteers ready to assist you. Understand; each dorm building is full. Upwards to one hundred people will be moving in. That is a LOT of boxes, luggage, and belongings. (*There will be another email with more recommendations about avoiding bringing too much!*). If you do decide that you truly need a refrigerator we will ask that it be placed on the front porch of your dorm building. We will place a sticker on it with your name and room number. Then, after we helped all of the other students move in their primary belongings we will assist you with the mini-refrigerator.

Q. What will happen if I bring a refrigerator that is "not so mini"; something bigger than 2-cubic feet, taller than 20-inches, and wider than 18-inches?

A. We will not permit those larger "mini" refrigerators to be brought in. Your family and friends will need to return it to their car and take it home.
